



- SHREDDED HICKORY MULCH (3") OVER EXTENT OF PLANTING AREA
- EXISTING TREES ON SITE PROVIDE LIMITED SHADE
- EDGE SPECIES CAN BE SUBSTITUTED WI JUNE GRASS



PLANTING NOTES:

1. Plant shrubs no sooner than two weeks after last herbicide treatment.
2. Parenthetic numbers represent plant totals for that particular area.
3. For forb areas (Low, Med, Tall), choose few species and plant in groupings of 6 or more.
4. After planting shrubs, plant ferns at 24-inch spacing.
5. After planting ferns, plant grasses and sedges at 18-inch spacing.
6. After planting grasses and sedges, plant forb (flowers) at 18-inch spacing.
7. Be certain to clear away mulch to expose soil.
8. A cordless drill with a planting auger bit can be used to drill holes for grasses, sedges and forbs.
Use a shovel or hand spade for shrubs and ferns.
9. Be certain to not plant plants either too deep or shallow: ensure top of plant's potting soil is level with existing soils.
