## When planting a shoreline buffer, ask yourself:

Do you need a permit before you install your shoreline buffer? If you answer yes to any of the four following questions, you probably will require one!

#### Are you going to use an herbicide in or near the water?

 If yes, contact the MN DNR Division of Waters- Fisheries serving the area where your shoreline property is located. The central office telephone number is 651-296-6157.

#### Are you planting or removing plants below the ordinary high water (OHW) level?

• If yes, contact the MN DNR Division of Fisheries- Aquatic Plant Management Program.

# Are you altering the shoreland (i.e. moving dirt, filing, regrading the slope) <u>below</u> the ordinary high water level?

• If yes, contact MN DNR Divison of Waters-Area Hydrologist at 651-772-7910.

#### Are you altering the shore (i.e. moving dirt, filling, regrading the slop) above the ordinary high water mark?

• If yes, contact your local units of government. You will probably need to submit your plan for review.
