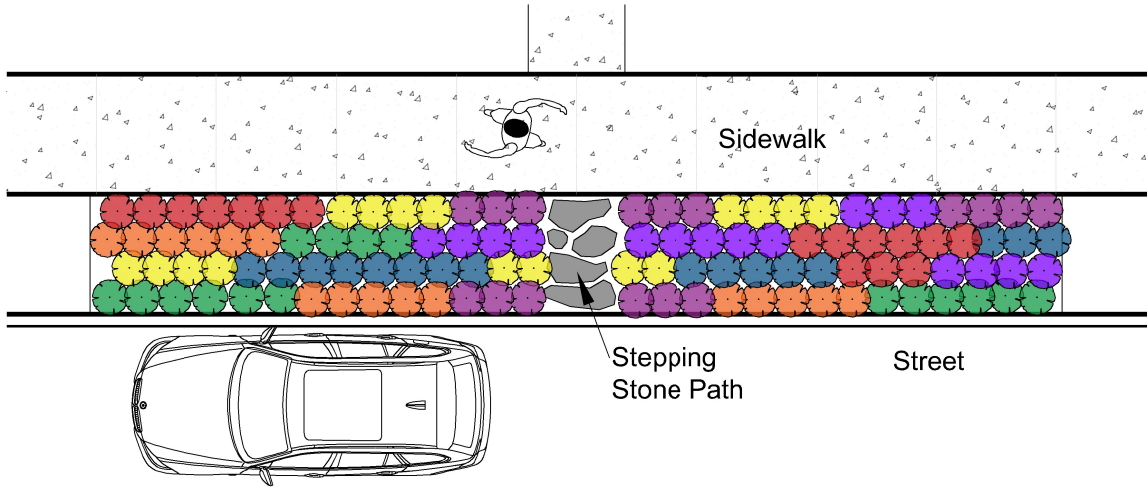


# PART SUN/PART SHADE PLANTING PALETTE

Part Sun/Shade areas receive 3 to 6 hours of sun in a day  
New planting is 200 square feet



## PLANT LIST (Possible Substitutions)

- Plant 1: Bradbury's Monarda or Penstemon or Jacob's Ladder
- Plant 2: Tall Thimbleweed (Spotted Bee Balm)
- Plant 3: Wild Geranium (Columbine)
- Plant 4: Pussytoes (Nodding Onion)
- Plant 5: Short's Aster (Heart Leaved Aster or Sky Blue Aster)
- Plant 6: Blue Grama (Side Oats Grama)
- Plant 7: Plains Oval Sedge (Long Beaked Sedge)

## PLANTING NOTES

Follow these notes to place your plants in the best location for them to thrive.

Always space all plants 15-inches from the center of one plant to the center of the next one, even if the plant tags say to place them differently.

Plant 4 should be placed beside the stepping stone path or beside the sidewalk. This is a short plant species and will not flop over onto the stepping stones or sidewalk.

Plant 7 should mostly be placed beside the street. This is a salt tolerant plant and will do better in the areas that receives more street salt in wintertime.

The remaining plants can be scattered throughout the boulevard in groupings as shown.
